Canine Neuter Homecare

Your pet has staples as the form of skin closure. These staples will need to be removed in 10- 14 days. Please set up an appointment time to have these removed.

Observe the incision for signs of irritation (redness, heat, swelling or drainage). There may be a small amount of swelling along the incision, which is a normal tissue reaction to buried sutures. If the swelling increases or you notice redness, heat or drainage please call our office to let the doctors know.

Do not allow your pet to lick, chew or scratch the incision. If your pet licks or chews continuously, please call the office and discuss it with our staff. The doctors may recommend taking steps to prevent the patient from self-inflicting damage.

Limit your pet's activity for the next two weeks. This means no jumping on or off of furniture and minimal use of stairs as these activities can cause stress to the incision and pain to the patient.

Saturdays 10:00am- 11:30am
